


### Rose Dedication Ceremony, October 27, 2018: The Names of Organ and Tissue Donors are added to The "Tree of Life"

**"Homeless Showers: Hope & Forever Healing"** The LAC+USC family has partnered with local community agencies to offer healing in a different way, through a fresh and clean shower. Showers will be offered once per week from September 7<sup>th</sup> to December 7<sup>th</sup>. CARES helps by providing clean clothing. To date, 427 community members have registered for showers (203 are LAC+USC Medical Center patients). Participants needing housing will be connected with the Housing for Health Program. The County Public Defender's Office takes applications for the Criminal Justice Clearing Project which evaluates and removes minor offenses from a person's record that can inhibit them from gaining employment. Hepatitis A and flu vaccines are provided. Community based events are not the traditional way that hospitals deliver care, but research has shown that extending services and benefits outside the customary walls can be invaluable to patients and community members.




