CARES Celebrates "44 Years of Service"

Lawrence D. Dorr, M.D., **CARES 2013 Annual Meeting** Speaker, is an international leader in the field of joint replacement of the hip and knee. He was recruited by the Keck School of Medicine of USC to expand its clinical expertise and capabilities in areas including joint replacement, sports medicine and spine surgery. His pioneering research has been instrumental in the design of widely used orthopaedic implants, as well as small incisions and the use of robotic surgery for total hip replacement. His humanitarian work has led him to operate in over 25 countries and has earned him many international honors.

Dr. Dorr says that "Physical activity is not only good for our bodies, but also our minds. Today, people want to stay active and engaged as long as they possibly can, and I'm looking forward to being part of a growing team of professionals that can help them achieve that."

Dr. Dorr is the author of the book "Die Once, Live Twice," an epic page-turner bringing to life the drama of scientific discovery and

the extraordinary achievements of modern medicine from its early days. It tells the story of the miracle workers who changed the face of medical care forever.

He is founding editor of the Journal of Arthroplasty, former editor-in-chief of Techniques in Orthopaedics, founder and past president of the Knee Society and the American Association of Hip and Knee Surgeons, past president of the Hip Society, and the list continues.

He received his medical degree from the University of Iowa Carver College of Medicine and completed his fellowship training in orthopaedics/arthritis surgery at the Hospital for Special Surgery in New York. After completing his residency at LAC+USC Medical Center, he served in the U.S. Navy as a lieutenant commander in the Medical Corps at Camp Pendleton, CA, and Jacksonville, Fla. He has been certified with the American Board of Orthopaedic Surgeons since


