Dear Friends of CARES.


No celebration of all that CARES has accomplished would be complete without celebrating "the vigor,

On behalf of CARES, Emma Farmer, RN, presented three LAC+USC Nurse of the Year Awards: RN, APN and LVN

After graduating from Northwestern, Lauri A. Parson began her first career working as a chemical engineer to troubleshoot and design processes for developing petroleum products. This career was stimulating scientifically, but she missed the camaraderie and interaction of working with others. When her children entered middle and high school, she decided to return to school herself to pursue an occupation that could combine her science background with her passion for working with people. In 2014, she became a registered nurse in the surgical field. The OR is where she feels she has found her calling because she is

Currently her efforts as Simulation Director involve curriculum standardization and interprofessional education as a means of patient safety improvement. James Jordan, LVN, LVN of the Year, explained how he became a nurse and why it is so important for him to treat every patient like family. He spent long hours with his mother Patricia as she battled stage four lung cancer. Each day was a small victory, how-eyer, much time was spent crying, holding each other's hands and talking about the past. Over the next two years, his path to health-care and nursing was solidified.

As he accompanied his mother to treatment, he found himself watching the nurses. They were attentive and compassionate, showing Patricia the gentle kindness you would show to your own family member. It wasn't just the fact that they were giving her life saving treatments, they took the time to learn about her. They talked to her about her love of gardening, they knew about her family, they tried making everything as painless as possible. Because of those nurses, he decided to make becoming an RN his personal goal.

He first worked as a CNA while attending the LVN program. He did rotations at many different locations, but found his roots and passion in pediatrics where he could be a voice for those who are often voiceless. Just as the nurses who cared for Patricia were her advocates, he wanted to do the same for children. Since graduating from the LVN program with academic honors, he has been working toward his RN and wants eventually to complete the FNP program to work in public health. The compassion shown by the nurses who cared for Patricia has stayed with him as well as the belief that caring for patients is a privilege. They have inspired him to become a nurse that makes a difference.



In Memoriam: Arthur J. Donovan, M.D.

Dr. Arthur J. Donovan was a very special friend of CARES because he was always available to answer questions about what happened in the Medical Center years ago because he never forgot anything! His late wife, **Jane Wooddell Donovan**, was the CARES Treasurer and Gift Shop volunteer for years and he always remembered her with donations to CARES.





In Memoriam: Bruce E. Zawacki, M.D.

Dr. Bruce Zawacki became a member of the CARES Advisory Committee after a large donation was made to the Burn Service, thus creating a fund for education and upgrading its environment to improve medical care for patients with burns. CARES was asked to create the Burn Family Room, a treatment-free refuge for pediatric burn patients. Chief of the LAC+USC Burn Unit from 1973 to 1998, Dr. Zawacki was a recognized authority on the surgical treatment of burns and a

devoted patient advocate. An associate professor emeritus at USC's Schools of Education, Medicine, and Religion, his research on the ethical dimensions of burn care helped elevate the patient's autonomy to a vital goal of treatment.
